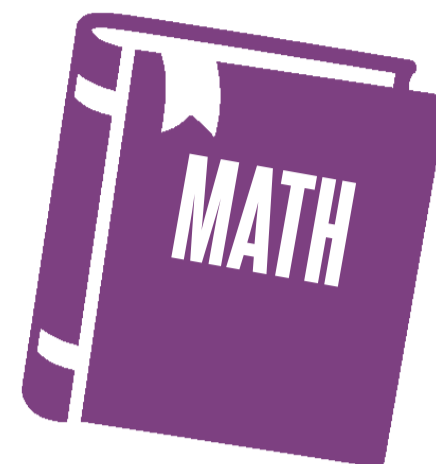


## SELECT A CAREER CLUSTER

Using the Interest Profiler on CFWV.com, you can review your interests to explore potential careers. By examining what interests you have and matching them with careers you are moving right along down the road.



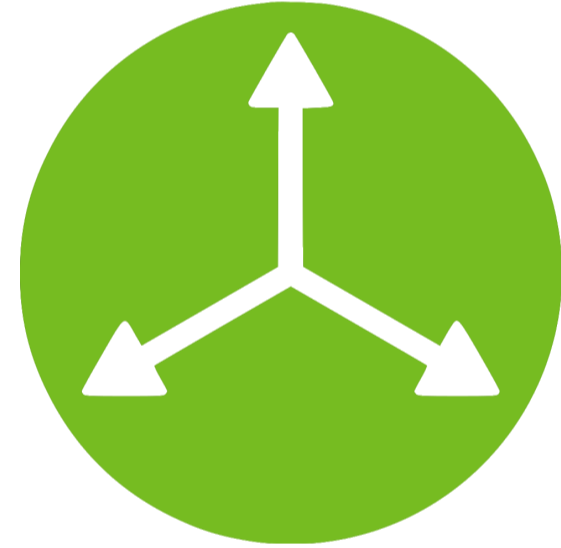
- Career Key**

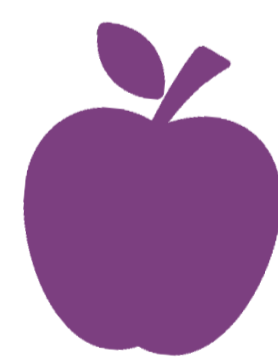


- Directions After High School Assessment**
